JOE GUNTER YOUTH OF THE YEAR SCHOLARSHIP



Mr. Joe Gunter dedicated his life to service and accomplished so much for the City of Salinas and the surrounding communities. After graduating high school, Joe joined the Marines and served in Vietnam. In 1969 he joined the Salinas Police Department and served 32 years, first as a patrolman and then a detective before retiring in 2002. Joe's commitment continued as he reported the very next day as a Reserve Officer conducting background investigations for the department. His dedication for the city he loved so much led him to serve for eight years as Mayor.

Mayor Gunter presented at over 10 Career Expo and Gang Prevention Summit events for the Boys & Girls Club, inspiring thousands of middle and high school students to make positive choices and puruse their dreams. He understood the importance of opportunities for youth, advocating for funding for BGCMC's transportation services, to ensure hundreds of youth are transported daily after school to the Salinas Clubhouse. Many organizations in our community can share similar stories about Mayor Gunter's tireless efforts to champion our kids and their futures.
